TODDLERS



Hands-on II

Building vocabulary; developing sensory and fine motor skills; recognising and identifying colours. This week, our toddlers explored the sky and weather through fun outdoor activities. In Maths, they identified sky colours and recognised the crescent shape in the moon. Using flashcards and wall displays, they learnt to name different weather conditions and observed the day's weather from their classroom window. For Physical Development, they practised leaf shading, while in Understanding the World, they made lovely Mother's Day cards. In Sensory Art, the children enjoyed a rainbow colours project, spreading colours with rulers and hands while naming each colour. A truly colour filled week of learning!





PLAYGROUP

The playgroup had a blast with a firefighter-themed activity! Climbing ladders like brave firefighters helped develop their strength, balance and imagination. In Expressive Arts, they designed their own firefighter helmets, learning about the role of firefighters and their equipment. NURSERY

The Nursery children explored the spring season, comparing it to Africa's rainy season. They enjoyed the story 'Peep and the Big Wide World: Spring Thing', learning how flowers blossom and animals give birth in spring. New vocabulary like blossom, germinate, drizzle, storm and flood were introduced. A visit to the sensory garden revealed their corn plants are growing well! In PSED, they practised kindness and polite words. In Numeracy, they worked on number recognition, shapes and quantities. Phonics lessons continued with blending sounds to read simple words, alongside practising colouring and pencil grip. Our Nursery class is full of action and discovery!



This week, Reception pupils explored numbers beyond 10, using objects, numerals and simple addition to deepen their understanding. In Understanding the World, they learnt about the lifecycle of a seed, showing great observational skills while drawing diagrams. Literacy lessons reinforced this topic, with children using their phonics knowledge to write short sentences. Daily phonics continued with new sounds and word reading. The week ended on a joyful note with a poem recital, singing 'Raindrops Falling All Around', and their much-loved swimming session. Well done, Reception!



THIS WEEK IN KS 1

YEAR 1

Our curious Year 1 learners went on a jungle adventure with The Jungle Book, using their imagination to describe Mowgli and build their confidence in expressing ideas. In Literacy, they explored articles "a", "an" and "the", learning when to use each one through fun sentence activities. Maths lessons focused on division and equal sharing, with pupils sorting objects into groups and solving problems using times tables. To wrap up the week, they enjoyed a lively basketball fun race in P.E., building teamwork, agility and having lots of laughs. A super exciting week in Year 1!







THIS WEEK IN KS 28.3



Year 3 wrapped up their unit on reproduction in flowering plants by illustrating the development stages of a broad bean seed and are now preparing for their assessment. Year 4 explored electrical conductivity, conducting experiments that revealed surprising results—graphite conducts electricity! Year 5 explored asexual reproduction, studying binary fission, budding and how tubers like yams reproduce. Year 7 created detailed diagrams of solar and lunar eclipses before going into the history of the space race. Year 8 tackled energy, demonstrating how gravitational potential energy transforms into kinetic energy with pulley experiments. An exciting week of scientific learning across the board!

This week in Maths, our students across the school explored a variety of exciting topics. Year 3 focused on fractions, learning to find unit and non-unit fractions of sets, solving reasoning problems and completing their fractions assessment. Year 4 wrapped up their decimals unit, mastering ordering, rounding and connecting fractions to decimals. Year 5 sharpened their geometry skills by accurately drawing lines, angles and calculating angles around points and straight lines. Year 7 worked on measuring and drawing angles up to 360°, including reflex angles, while Year 8 have started looking at constructions and properties of triangles and quadrilaterals, explored diagonals and used angle facts to solve problems. A productive and enriching week of mathematical discovery!
