A well-rounded curriculum is what puts smiles on our children's faces every week. The week began with our specialised PE sessions, followed by whole-class music, finished off with a very successful 'World Book Day' promoting a love for reading. And this was just for starters...



This week, **Toddlers** worked together to design their fire engine after learning how brave firefighters were. They didn't just make the fire engine sounds 'Nee Naw, Nee Naw'. They also had fun learning about colours.

In our maths class, **Playgroup** counted the number of seeds in a pawpaw (Papaya) fruit and described the seeds as *tiny seeds*. They went out to plant the seeds and based their role play on the book '*Olivia Plants a Garden*' where all the children came dressed in their gardening clothes as we marked 'World Book Day'.
