It has been a fantastic week exploring nutrition and healthy activities with the **Toddlers** - they learned about colour, size, shape and the smell of foods. They sang the song 'One potato, two potatoes' and more.

This week in **Reception**, the focus was on Space and what they might see. They learned about fiction books and explored weight and capacity through balance scales - filling cups with sand until they were half full and full. They have also been very busy learning about habitats and what animals need to live.

Year 1 class had a jam-packed week with lots of practical learning activities. In literacy, they began writing their stories, changing the characters and settings, followed by lots of practical maths on related facts to 20 and beyond. Not to mention assembly practice. What superstars you all are. Year 1 was really on fire this week — 'London's burning, London's burning...'

It has been a fun week of outdoor exploration in Years 2/3 – counting mini beasts and using this information for a tally chart and pictogram. They also investigated the different ways the shape of objects can be changed, relating this to the properties of the materials the objects are made from. They had a very intense debate today on whether or not deforestation should be allowed to continue - they are very passionate about stopping deforestation.





Years 4 and 5 have been young scientists this week. The class had a practical session on 'States of Matter'. The children observed different changing phases of matter such as boiling, condensation, evaporation and freezing. Whilst this was just a fraction of the work done, they also learned about figurative language, fronted adverbials, long division and related multiplication facts. The list goes on and on.
