A happy new month to you all!

This week has been incredibly active with lots of PE practice for sports day and investigatory outdoor learning. The school grounds have been alive with very busy bees.

Special People were the focus in Toddlers. They had lots of fun looking at family photographs whilst reading the book 'Owl Babies'. The children also had fun collecting flower petals and leaves from the garden to build their own homes.







Playgroup class focused on moving slowly and quickly this week. We talked about things that move at different speeds and used snails to demonstrate this - the children were fascinated as they watched the snails move. They showed amazing care and consideration while holding the snails and were reminded to be gentle. Of course, the snails were sent back to their habitats safely!







This week, **Nursery** went on board the airplane with Peppa Pig at the airport. Captain Emergency, the pilot, lifted off the runway into the sky! Can you blow up a balloon without using your mouth? **Nursery** can, with the help of some extraordinary scientific knowledge!





This week, **Reception** continued to learn about **space**. The children asked questions such as "What are asteroids made of?" and used nonfiction books to answer the questions. They also continued learning about **capacity and weight**. They had fun pouring water from one container to another to see which ones held **more or less**.

A recap on **Place Value** took **Year 1** on lots of outdoor pursuits this week, which resulted in the building of many Place Value homes. **Poetry** took them on a descriptive adventure through the World of verses, stanzas and rhyming-words. Year 1 has definitely been on a fantastic learning journey.

The adventure continued in Years 2 and 3, learning about persuasion and how to use it in adverts and letters. They also squished and squelched in the land of slime - making different types of slime to explore reversible and irreversible changes that occur when you combine different materials. After some research about indigenous people of the rainforest, the children found out the types of homes they live in and how they survive in the rainforest.





As always, Years 4 and 5 have been smashing through the curriculum. Their journey began with the water cycle and a helpful mnemonic to help remember the stages – Eve Can Pet Ants: E for evaporation, C for condensation, P for Precipitation and A for Accumulation. WW1 was next, with the powerful and emotive works from Wilfred Owen and Rupert Brooke, the children certainly enjoyed some moving poetry in preparation for their own masterpieces. Years 4 and 5 then stumbled upon a great method for calculating fractions - The butterfly method. What an amazing week!
