

This week, our students sharpened their literacy skills by writing informal letters and exploring past tense verbs. In history, they learnt about the Great Fire of London and its impact on modern building safety, while geography lessons focused on identifying seasons in temperate regions. Science was hands-on as students conducted experiments, fueling their curiosity! In numeracy, they mastered position and direction using mathematical language. French lessons expanded their vocabulary with job titles and in music, they read notes while playing the recorder, focusing on rhythm and coordination. A truly enriching week of learning!

THIS WEEK IN KS 28.3



This week, our students explored fascinating science topics! Year 3 examined flower specimens up close, learning about their reproductive parts. Year 4 conducted a hands-on experiment with guitar strings to understand how pitch changes. Year 5 and Year 7 jumped into cell biology, comparing plant and animal cells and discovering their vital structures. Meanwhile, Year 8 wrapped up their studies on Acids and Alkalis, investigating their reactions before preparing for their assessment. A fantastic week of scientific exploration and discovery!

This week, our students embarked on exciting mathematical journeys! Year 3 explored measurement, mastering scales and mass in grams and kilograms. Year 4 tackled fraction addition, gaining confidence in combining fractions and mixed numbers. Year 5 connected fractions and decimals, working with tenths and decimal places. Year 6 got into ratios, learning to use ratio language, symbols and scale drawings. Year 7 sharpened their skills in order of operations and calculating areas of different shapes. Year 8 mastered percentages, including working with values over and under 100% and explored powers of 10. Well done to our problem-solvers!



This week, our students sharpened their literacy skills across various exciting topics! **Year 3** wrapped up their study on word classes with a hands-on colourcoding activity. At the same time, **Year 4** explored adverbials and their role in building tension in storytelling. **Year 5** mastered relative clauses and showcased their knowledge in a spirited debate and spelling bee. **Year 7** got busy with poetry analysis, focusing on structure and tone, proving their rhetorical skills in a friendly debate. **Year 8** took on language techniques, analysing "The Schoolboy" poem before dominating competitions. A great week of expressing creativity and learning!

THIS WEEK IN KS 28.3

In History classes this week, **Year 4**'s lessons stole the spotlight. As part of our cultural studies on the indigenous aborigines of Australia, the students embarked on an exciting journey to learn about the traditional Aboriginal dot painting technique. This ancient art form has been an integral part of Aboriginal culture for thousands of years, telling stories of their ancestors, land and traditions. The pupils used cotton buds for their dot painting and created amazing artworks.





This week in French, students expanded their vocabulary and communication skills across various topics. Year 3 looked at sports vocabulary, with students engaging in role-plays and discussions about their favourite activities. Year 4 explored maths concepts and shapes, learning to describe and identify geometric forms. In Year 5, lessons focused on seasons and weather, helping students describe conditions and preferences through conversations and listening exercises. Years 7 & 8 practised inviting and responding to invitations, using both formal and informal expressions. Through interactive activities, reading and speaking exercises, the french students strengthened their fluency and cultural awareness in a fun and engaging way!
